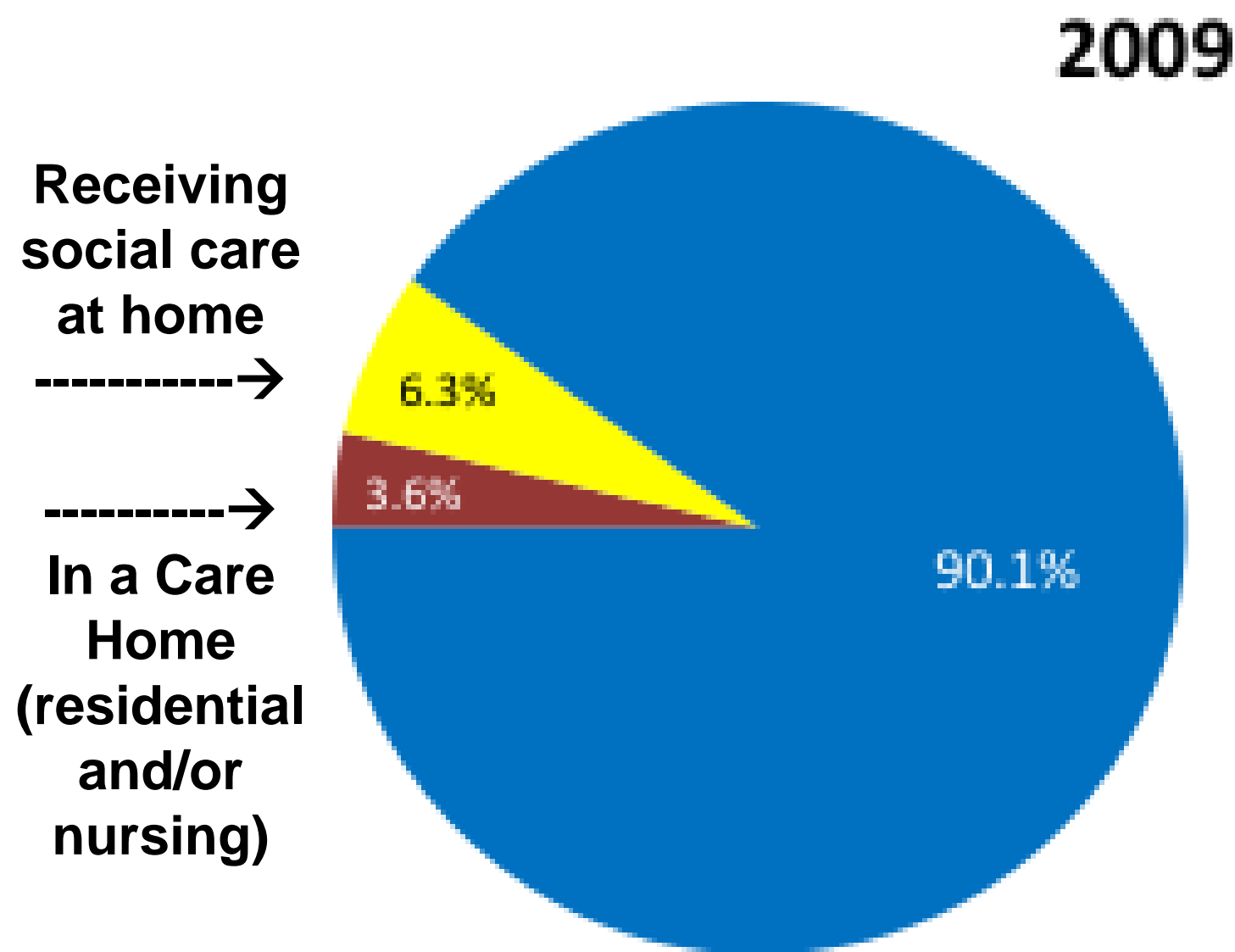

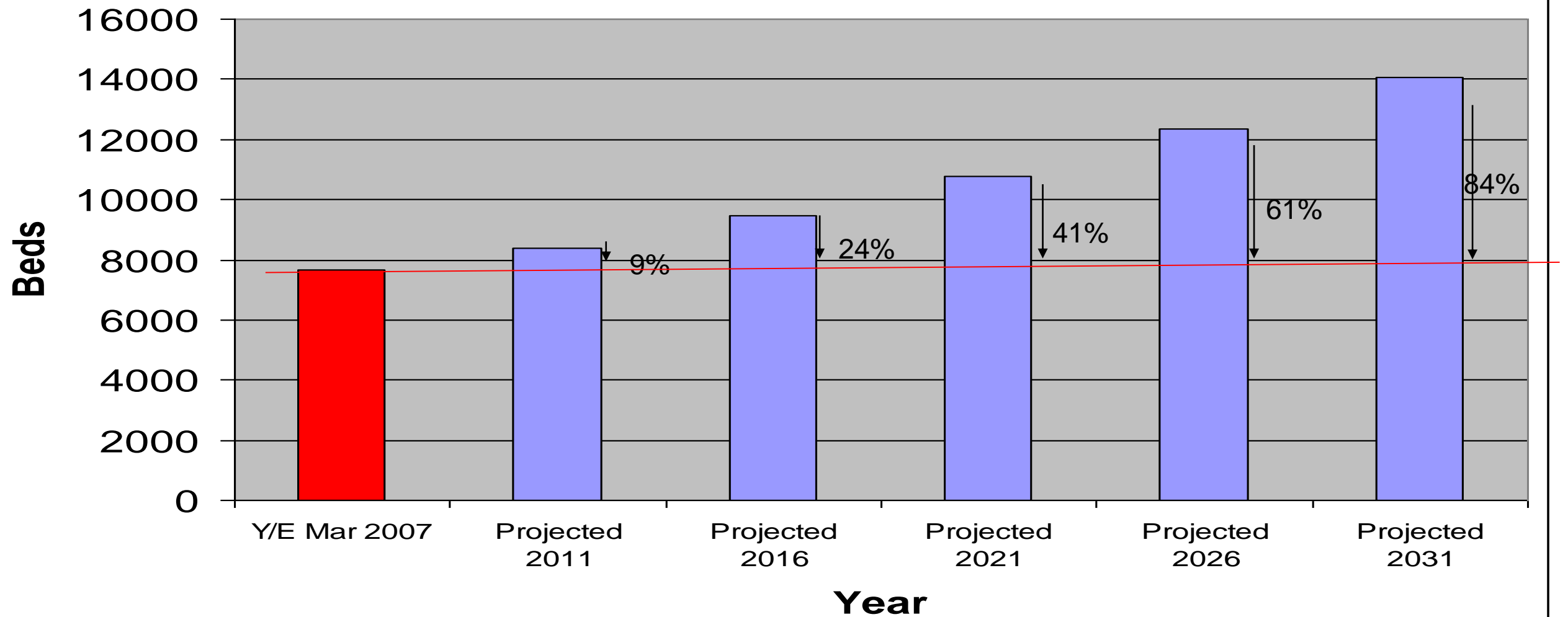

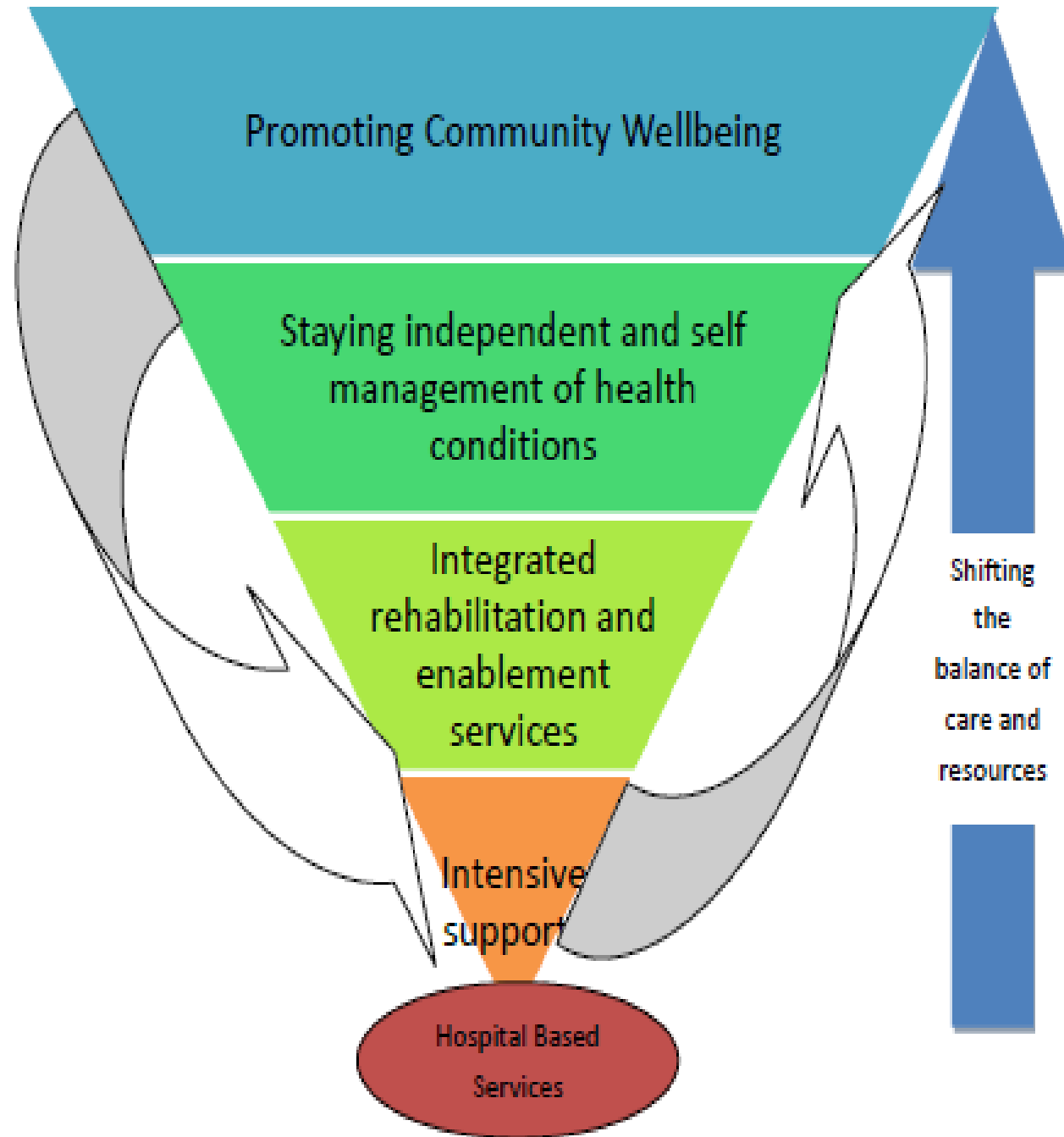
## Demographic change for population aged 65+ Scotland Potential impact on emergency bed numbers 2007-2031

Figure 2 Reshaping Care for Older People Model

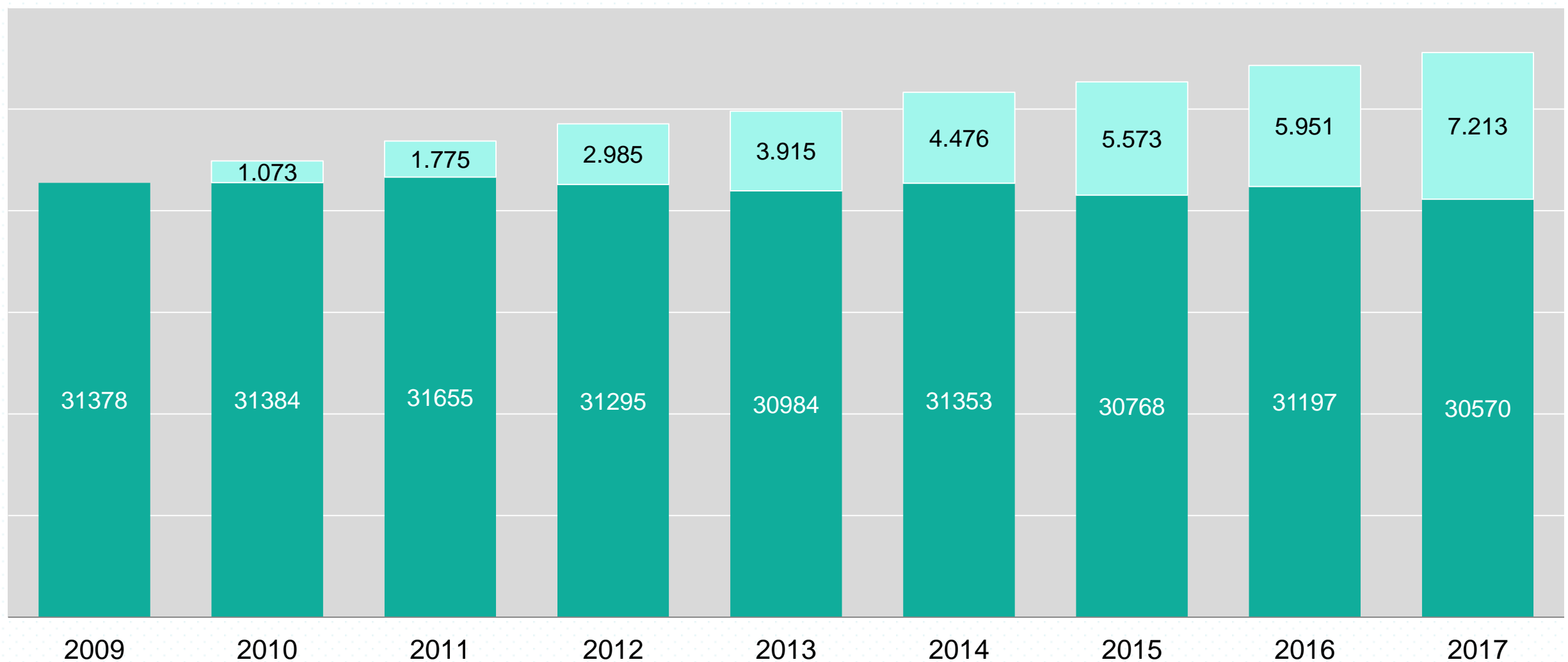

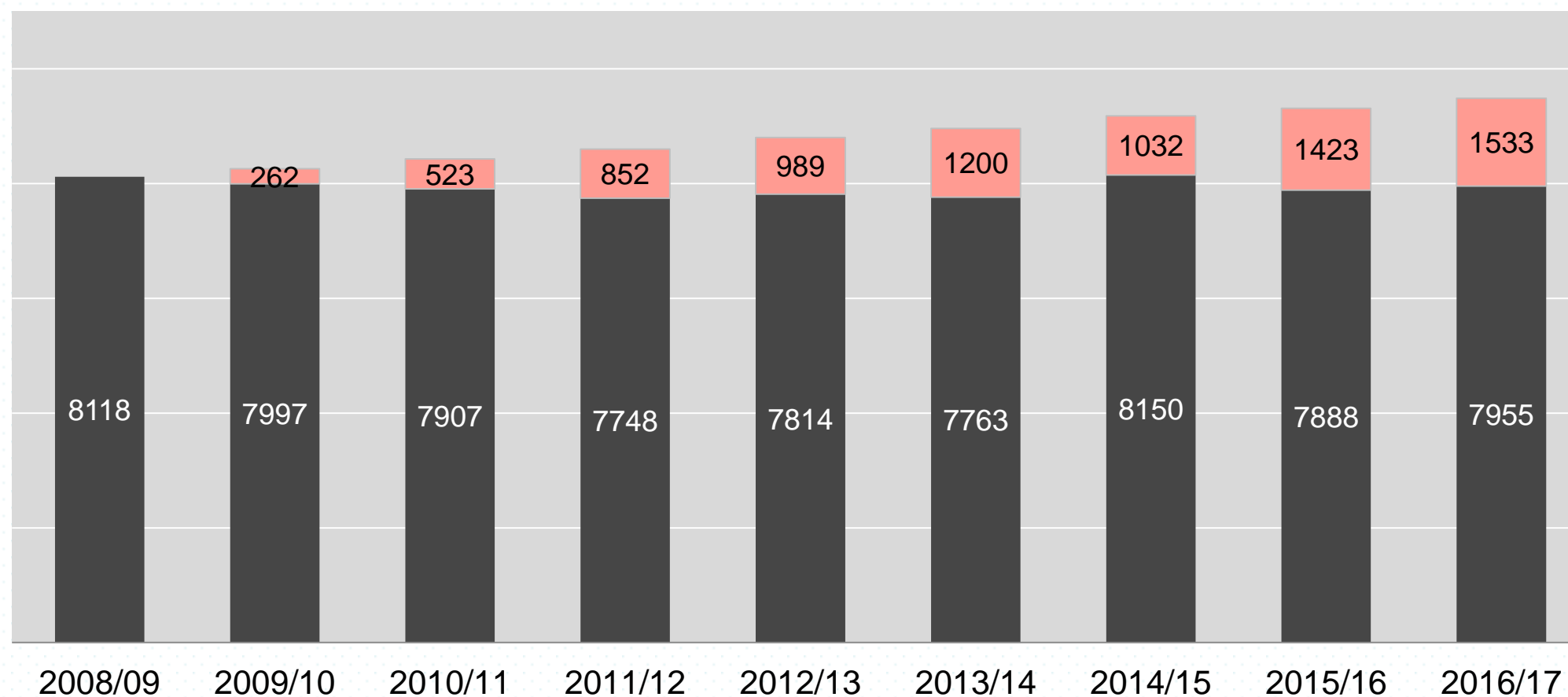

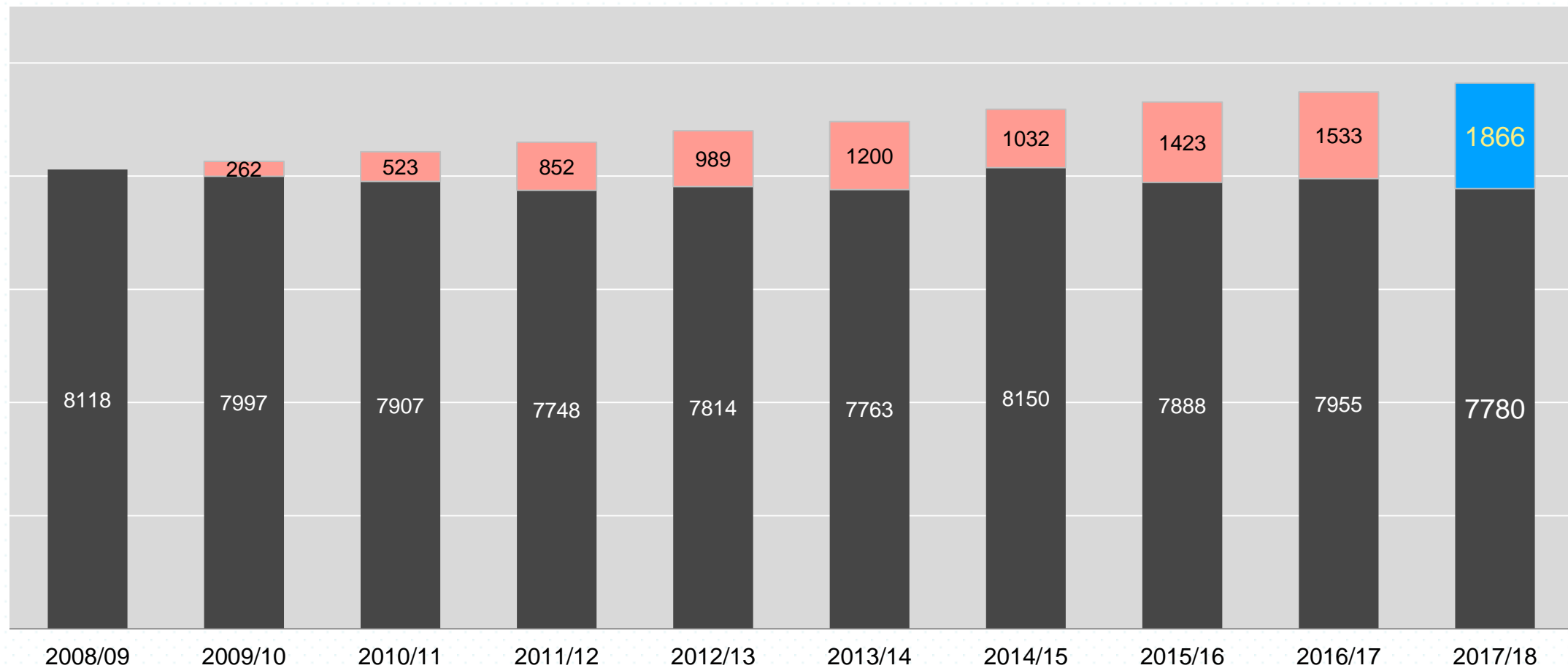

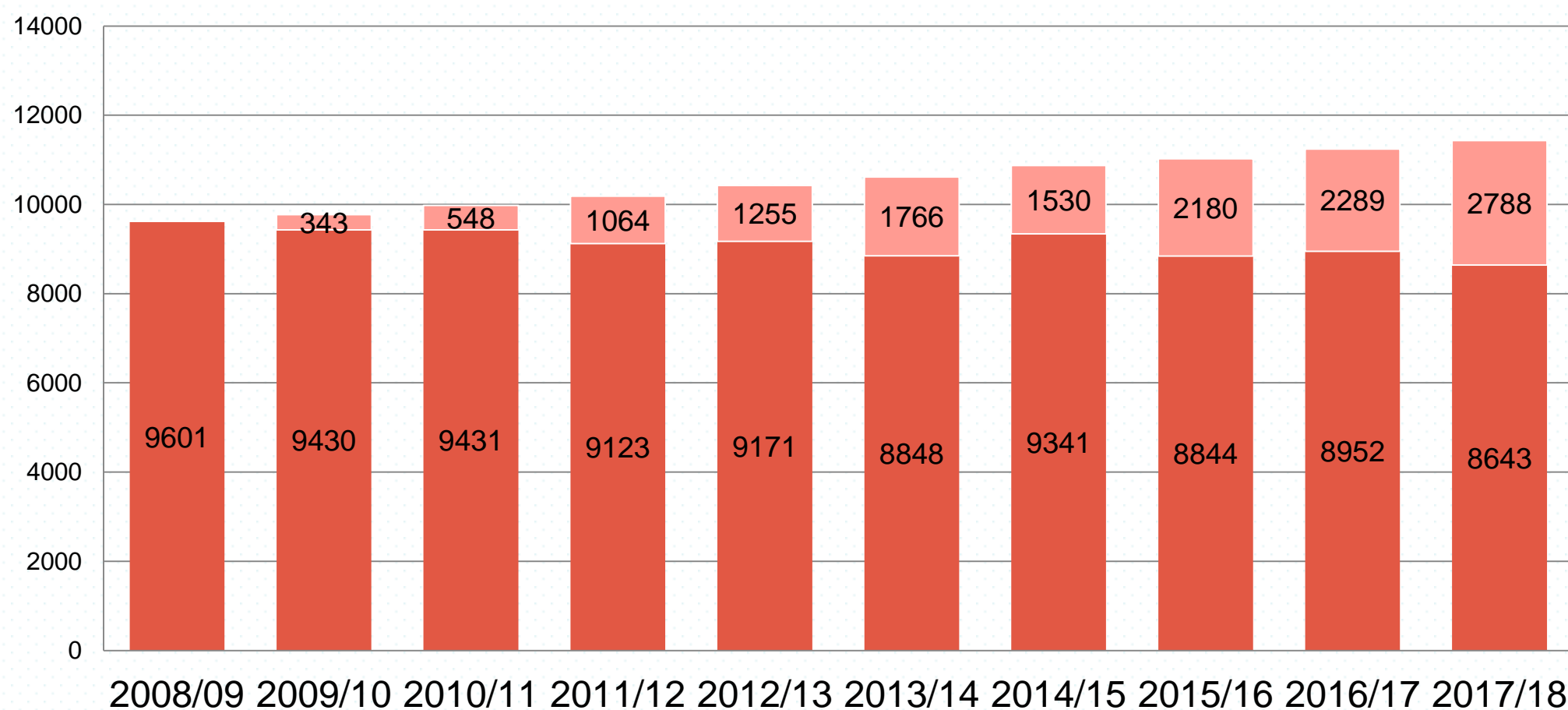

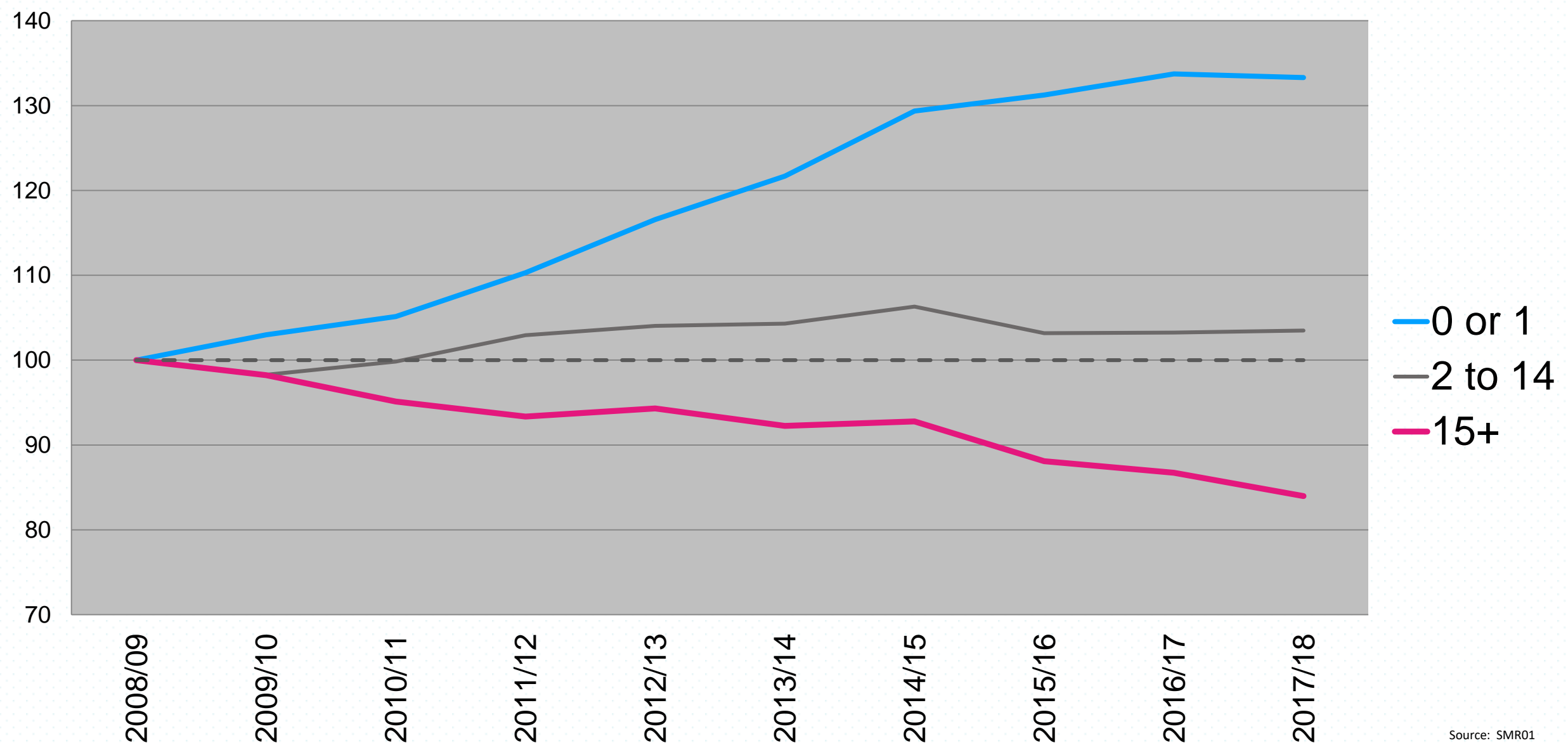
# Emergency beds and long stay beds for older people, Scotland; actual vs projected

(based on 2008/09 population)



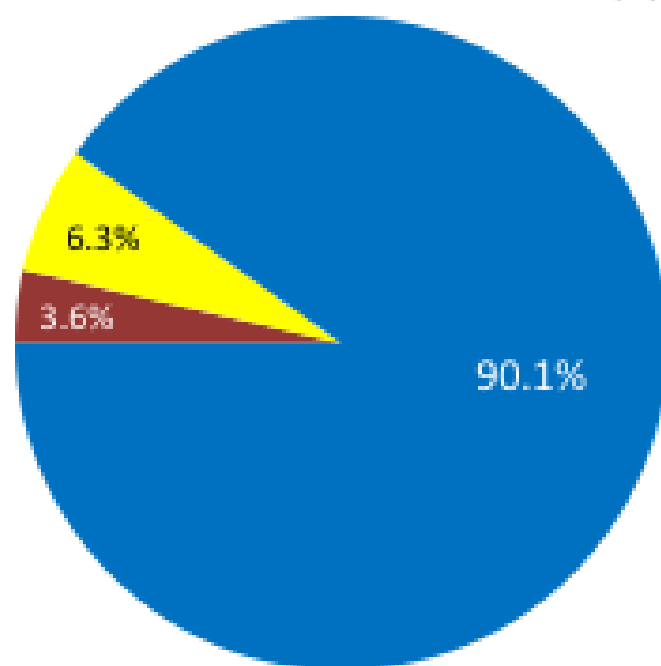
# Hospital admissions for over 75s rising but length of stay falling

(Indexed to base year 2008/09)**



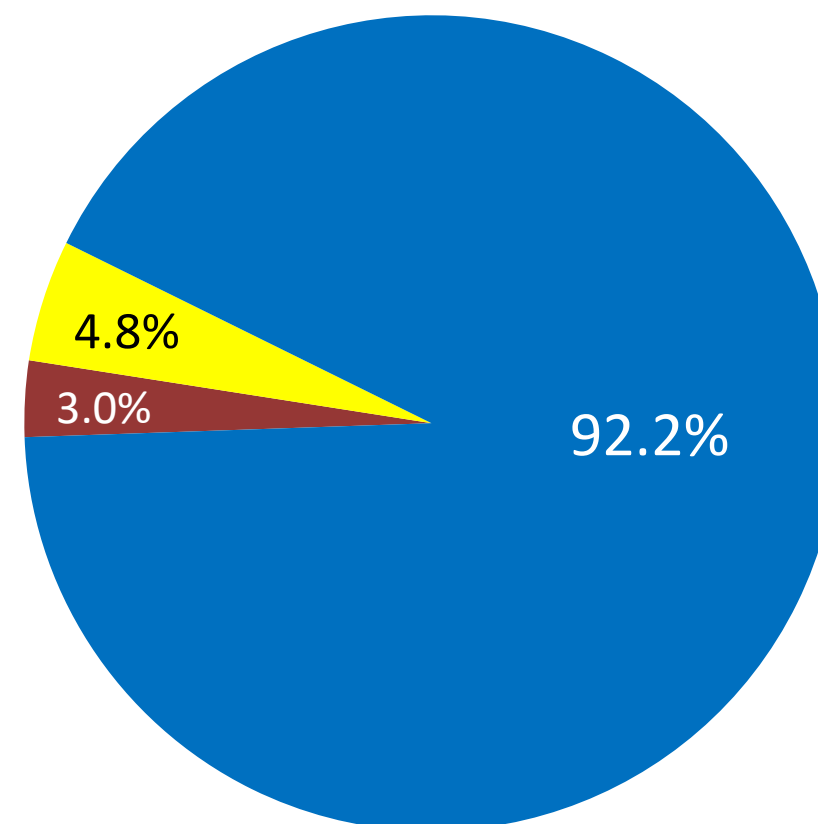
